TENSE

Definition: Tense is the form in which a verb is used to express when an action will be performed.

Tense denote the time of verbs.

Three types of tense like_

- A. Present tense.
- B. Past tense.
- C. Future tense.

A. Present tense: 4 types of present tense. like_

- 1. Present Indefinite.
- 2. Present continuous.
- 3. Present perfect.
- 4. Present perfect continuous.

1. Present indefinite: Present indefinite tense denotes an action in the present time or habitual truth.

Structure: Sub+ Present form of verb + obj:

Use of present indefinite tense:

- 1. To express present action or events or fact.
- 2. To express a habitual action.
- 3. To express general truth.
- 4. In imperative sentence.
- 5. In quotations and reporting.

Example:- I read a book.

The sun rises in the east.

2. Present continuous: When an action is continued or going to be continued in near future is called present continuous.

Structure: Sub + **am**/**is**/**are** + (**verb** + **ing**)+ **obj:**

Use of present continuous:

- 1. For an action going on at the time at speaking.
- 2. Imagining an unseen activity.
- 3. For an action that is plonnedor arrganed to take place in the near future.
- 4. For giving information about third person where about.
- 5. For describing.

Example:- I am reading a book. We are reading a book.

3. Present perfect: Present perfect tense is used when the work has been done but its effect lasts.

Structure: Sub + have/has + main verb past participle + obj:

Use of present perfect:

- 1. To indicate completed action in the immediate past.
- 2. To express past action whose time is not definite.
- 3. To denote an action beginning at some time past and continuing up to the present moment.

Example: - I have done the work.

We have done the work.

3. Present perfect continuous: The present perfect continuous tense is used for an action which began at some time in the past and still continuing.

Structure: Sub + has been/have been + (verb + ing) + obj;

Use present perfect continuous:

1. For an action which began at some time in the past and still continuing.

Example: - Lipka has been waiting you for long time.

B. Past tense: 4 types of past tense. like_

- 1. Past indefinite.
- 2. Past continuous.
- 3. Past perfect.
- 4. Past perfect continuous.

1. Past indefinite: Past indefinite tense is used to denote on action completed in the past or a past habit.

Structure: Sub + **past form of verb** + **obj;**

Use of past indefinite:

- a. It often occurs with adverbs.
- b. Sometimes it is used without an adverb of time.
- c. Simple past is also used for past habits.

Example: - I did the work.

You did the work.

2. Past continuous: Past continuous tense is used when the action was continued from some times in the past.

Structure: Sub + **was/were** + (**verb** + **ing**) + **obj**;

Use of past continuous:

- 1. To talk about any continuing process of doing something in the past.
- 2. To describe a back ground action.

Example:- She was playing football. I was playing football.

3. Past perfect: Past perfect tense is used in the former action between two completed actions in the past.

Structure: Sub + had + verb.p.p + obj;

Use of past perfect:

- 1. To describe an action completed before an action moment in the past.
- 2. If two action happened in the past.

4. Past perfect continuous: Past perfect continuous tense is used for an action that begun before a certain point in the past and continued up to that time.

Structure:- Sub + **had been** + (**verb** + **ing**) + **obj**;

Use of past perfect continuous:

1. To express an action that continued in the past for a given period of time.

C.Future tense: 4 types of future tense. like_

- 1. Future indefinite
- 2. Future continuous.
- 3. Future perfect.
- 4. Future perfect continuous.
- 1. **Future indefinite:** Future indefinite tense is used when an action will be done or will happen in future.

Structure: Sub + shall/will + present form of verb + obj;

Example: I shall go to school. You will go to school.

2. **Future continuous:** Future continuous tense is used when an action is thought to be going on the future.

Structure: Sub + shall be/will be + (verb + ing) + obj;

Example: I shall be doing the work. She will be doing the work.

3. **Future perfect**: Future perfect tense is used to indicate the complete of an action by a certain time in the future.

Structure: Sub + shall have/will have + verb.p.p + obj;

Example: I shall have written the letter by that time.

4. Future perfect continuous: Future perfect continuous tense is used by a certain future.

Structure: Sub + shall have been/will have been + (verb+ ing) + obj;

Example:- I shall have been doing the work before my father comes.
